The School of Law, JEMTEC has constituted the Moot Court Society (MCS), School of Law, in 2016. There are 22 active members in the society from various batches. Mooting as an activity aims to inculcate and improve the research, presentation and argument talent into students so as to equip the budding lawyers with all the court room etiquettes, research experience and advocacy skills. The MCS' role is to facilitate and regulate mooting. Firstly, this involves planning, organizing and executing the various moot court competitions that are hosted by the School of Law. MCS's second major mandate is to constitute the College Moot Team, a process which decides ranking of those selected students who will represent the School of Law, in National and International Moot Court Competitions. The MCS organizes extensive workshops and demonstrations to enable the students from the first year onwards to learn the process of mooting from the very basics to the most intricate details. The Moot Court Society of the School of Law has organized three Intra Moot Court Competitions. Selected students were sent to National Moot Court competitions. Since the very beginning, students of School of Law have shown consistency in their excellence in National Moot Court competitions. The students were participated in 3rd International Moot Court Competition, 2015 organized by Amity Law School, Centre II, Amity University in 2015 and 6th Jamia Millia Islamia Moot Court Competition, 2016.

The MCS further arranges for interactive sessions with experienced mooters from other leading institutions including National Law Schools to train the students.
